- 1. Come to Order // Pledge of Allegiance 7:02 pm
- 2. Community Resource Officer, Jhett Sarmiento. (*Absent Crime report provided by the Chair*) Larceny, 5 stolen autos
- 3. Approval of January 4, 2024 Draft January minutes previously posted, <u>motion to approved is</u> <u>passed at 7:03 pm.</u>

- 5. Guest Speakers.
  - East Ocean View Beach <u>Sand Replenishment</u> (Chuck Joyner, Norfolk)
    - Summary: According to Norfolk's Office of Resilience, the Corps is preparing a planning and scheduling effort that should begin full beach renourishment actions in early CY2026. The Corps has also been very helpful supporting the City's ongoing stop-gap sand renourishment effort at the eastern end of Ocean View Beach. This effort will be completed in March 2024 and should delay further damage to the dune system until the full replenishment effort begins. We will need your continued support to satisfy the funding requirements the Corps has identified for their FY2024 Work Plan to conduct the preparatory tasks, and the funding for an anticipated FY2025 contract award.
    - Short Term Details: Provided update short term sand hauling operation underway, in cooperation with HRBT, 14000 cu yd , \$550K effort , 6" under max Eleva, 27 bay and jetty, 50 trucks/day, 450-50 cu yd / day, complete ½ week or March, not safe for beach goers, narrow beach, closure, placing from jetty to west.
    - Long Term Details: Nourishment federal cycle initiated 2017, working with Army Corps of Engineers to accelerate funding, Fed continuing resolution is a concern with timeline, expected for 2026 relative 2 years delay, need to identify borrow area, council ordinance adoption 13<sup>th</sup> of this month to start design authority to get on beach to do design work, easement, etc. –
    - Q/A way to make permanent, shorten cycle,

    - The 2nd Precinct reinitiated their quarterly meetings with their CL Presidents. Overall the 2023 violent and property crimes in our Sector (BLUE) are down > than 50% from 2022.
    - Precinct is operating at 65% of authorized personnel levels 110 / 128 available for duty

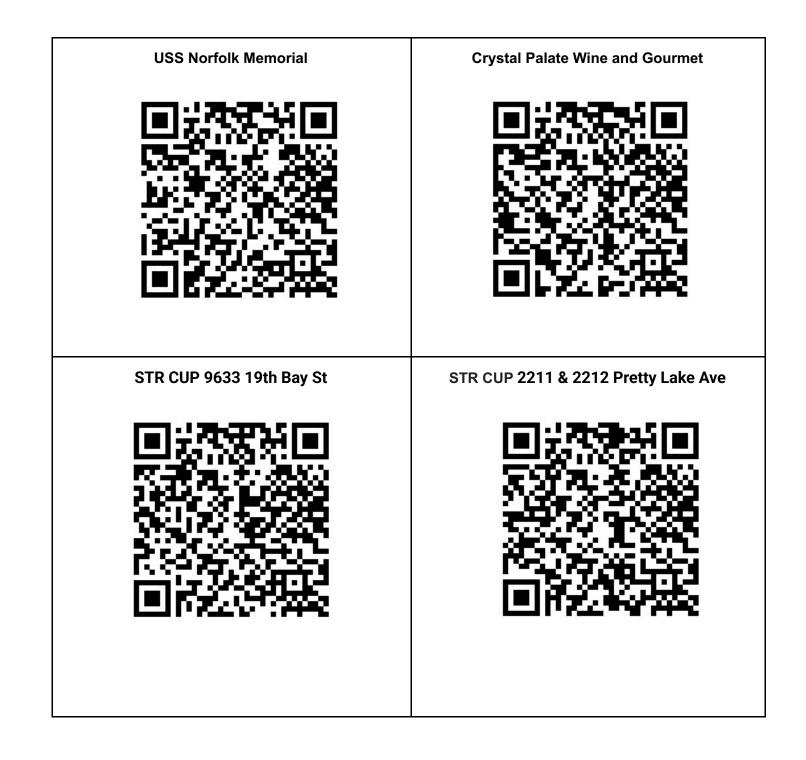
