





- Request EOV Civic League Endorsement on CUP
 Norfolk requires 2 parking spots in coastal area(Home has 4 available on property)
- Once CUP approved owner will post signs inside and out outside with emergency contact information and city 24 hour call center

Property management Plan


- · Will only rent to out of town visitors
